Governments and businesses are increasingly making decisions that could adversely impact the future of the Internet. How these challenges are addressed will affect services of all sizes, the ability of billions of people to share information with the world and hear from others across borders, the future of the digital economy, and the survival of a free and secure Open Internet. The potential consequences are vast, go far beyond today's headlines, and are bigger than any one company. There are no easy answers, and there are a lot of trade-offs.

This session will introduce participants to perspectives from Twitter and several civil society organizations on the future of internet governance. Twitter will introduce its five principles for regulating the Internet, and how they intersect with issues of competition, content moderation, algorithm transparency and the role and responsibilities of tech platforms. Twitter offers these principles to inform the policy debate, recognising the need to balance tackling harm with protecting the Open Internet.

The workshop will start with an introduction on what we mean when we talk about the "Open Internet." Twitter will then moderate the workshop with a few guided questions on the future of Open Internet, such as what does a global and open internet mean and why is it important to the panelists' work? What are the biggest threats to the Open Internet and what should we do to protect this global and Open Internet?
